Who?

University of Kansas Faculty are leading this project that will prepare Master's students in Special Education and Speech-Language Pathology.

What?

Project INSTRUCT is focused on preparing Special Education teachers and Speech Language Pathologists to support students with intellectual and developmental disabilities and complex communication needs to be included in the general education classroom. This project is funded by the Office of Special Education Programs and provides students with funding for tuition, fees, and attendance at a national conference.

Where?

The courses that Project INSTRUCT students take are offered at the University of Kansas campus in Lawrence. Master's students enrolled in Project INSTRUCT teach and provide support for students with intellectual and developmental disabilities and complex communication needs at various school sites in and near Lawrence.

When?

Project INSTRUCT is currently accepting applications for Fall 2022 and is five years long.

Why?

This Project is needed to provide Special Education teachers and Speech Language Pathologists opportunities to collaborate and learn about how to provide inclusive supports.
